Students from the North Lakes Creative Theatre Production class will perform one of six short plays at the Cremorne Theatre at the Queensland Performing Arts Complex in June.

Each play, performed by a different Australian School of Performing Arts Film and Television ensemble group, will have an original interpretation of the title LA Land ... Not All Those Who Wander Are Lost.

Teacher/director Talia Rowley said the North Lakes cast had found their own unique take on the title.

"After a few weeks of brainstorming, the group decided to set their play among the chaos of a kooky hair salon. The characters, a group of high-school kids, have landed themselves an internship at a local hairdresser," she said.

"However, this salon has come straight out of LA Land; from its weirdly wonderful hairdos to the creatively kooky staff – this place is proving to be anything but normal."

She said the production gave students the chance to be exposed to a number of facets of the performing arts industry, with performers involved in scripting the play.

"We want the wider community to see what can be done when a group of passionate kids put their minds to it," Ms Rowley said.
